We will start our drive through some of the places of memory in Sofia. We will drive to the National Museum of History. Along the way we will pass by the "People's Palace" or the National Palace of Culture (built in the early 1980s as the biggest congress and event center in Bulgaria).

About 14.30 – Arrival at the National Museum of History.

The building of the museum was part of the state-owned complex of residences of the highest-ranking members of the Communist party. Its architecture combines local decorative elements and modern achievements in architecture, influenced by the Boston City Hall style. Currently, there are displayed some of the most valuable archaeological and historical objects, related to the history of the Bulgarian territories.

16.00 – Visit to the Banner of Peace Monument.

The monument is emblematic for the last decade of the communist regime in Bulgaria when the Communist party tries to find new symbols and aesthetics. A significant part of the monument is dedicated to the numerous bells, donated by 79 countries around the world.

16.45 – Trip back to the center of Sofia.

En route we will pass by one of the biggest and believed to be one of the most representative workers quarters in Sofia *Mladost* (meaning 'Youth'). The urban project started in the 1960s, but a significant number of the so called prefabricated panel buildings (*panelki*) have been constructed in the late 1970s and 1980s in order to meet the influx of people coming to the capital.

About 17.30 – expected arrival back to the St. Alexander Nevsky Cathedral in the city center.
